

# NEWSLETTER: TERM 3 - WEEK 8 Monday 7th, September 2020

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Tena koutou nga matua nga whaea me nga whanau katoa,

It was very disappointing to have x5 of our students vaping on the school bus this morning. We have had a call from Ritchies Bus Company to inform us that these students will be reported to MOE and will be stood down from catching the school bus for a week. I have included an article below about the risks of vaping. Parents/caregivers - you may all like to read and discuss this article with your child/children.

Some people have been led to believe that vaping is completely safe. However, there are significant risks to be aware of - especially for young people. **Exposure to nicotine**: Nicotine is a stimulant that makes the nervous system prepare the body for physical and mental activity. It causes breathing to become more rapid and shallow, and increases the heart rate and blood pressure. Nicotine exposure from vaping varies quite a bit depending upon the contents of the e-liquid, the type of device used and how it is used. Vaping exposes young people to nicotine at a time when the brain is most at risk for addiction. Because the brain continues to develop until early adulthood, roughly age 25-30, use of any addictive substance prior to these years is especially risky. Young people who vape are affected much more than adults by nicotine.

Due to the vaping incident on the school bus this morning, we request that students no longer bring pouch bags (i.e. hip pack or waist bags) to school. **Thank you in advance for your understanding.**
