## <u>Tupu Tuakana</u>

How time flies, it is week 3 already. A huge welcome to Nevaeh Nairn who started in Tupu Tuakana last week. We love having new students in our kura.

This term we are learning about wayfinding/navigators who found their way to Aotearoa. This week the spotlight is on Hui Te Ranigiora who was a high-born rangatira and great explorer. He set sail with his crew from Rarotonga to Aotearoa around the year 650AD. Here are a few snippets of what we know so far:

Hui Te Rangiora came from Rarotonga and he was a navigator. He used the stars and the sun and the moon and the ocean currents and the fish. He was a traveller and he was trying to go to New Zealand but instead the currents changed and instead he went into the Southern Ocean.

- Taonga

Hui Te Rangiora lived in Rarotonga and he was a navigator who travelled all around the Pacific Ocean. He tried to go to New Zealand but the currents was too strong so he got pulled all the way to Antarctica. Hui Te Rangiora used the stars and the waves.

- Jarell

Hui Te Rangiora was a traveller and he was going to New Zealand. He went past New Zealand because of the oceans currents. He was in the Southern Ocean and he saw seals and a big ice berg. Then the ocean currents took Hui te Rangiora back north to New Zealand.
