It is important to contact the school if your child is absent. **To report an absence: Phone us on 09 4053901, email our Principal - principal@waima.school.nz**. Unexplained absences are of concern. A reminder that in order for our students to receive the best education possible, they need to be at school every day. MOE now requests our attendance register on a daily basis. We will be sending home reports on your child/children's attendance on a regular basis. We look forward to a year of regular attendance to allow teachers to deliver learning programs on a daily basis. Please do our tamariki a favour by insisting they attend daily. Thank you in advance!!

If your child is sick, then please keep them at home and phone the office to inform us of non attendance.

Waima School is now available via 'The Skool Loop App'. We're introducing this new communication method to our school community in hopes of improving parent/caregiver engagement. It'll allow you to receive prompt notifications to your phone so that you can get important updates faster than ever.

Moving forward, you'll have easier access to the direct contact information of our Principal and teaching staff. You'll also be able to report an absence via the Skool Loop app within a few minutes by completing and submitting an absentee form.

Important Notice about Road Safety

Reminders for parents and caregivers:

- Caregivers are responsible for safely transporting their children to and from their school bus stop and as such are best placed to decide the safest way to do this.
- Stick to the speed limit: it's 20kph when passing a stopped school bus (on either side of the road).
- Drop your tamariki off on the same side of the road as the bus stop.
- Teach your tamariki to always get out of the car on the side closest to the curb.
- Always take your tamariki to and from the bus-stop.
- Teach your tamariki not to run across the road.
- Remind your tamariki on how to keep safe boarding and disembarking the bus:
- While waiting at the bus stop, keep well back from the road.
- Wait until the bus has completely stopped and the door opens before getting on.
- After getting off the bus, stand well back from the road and wait until the bus has gone and you can see clearly before moving.










Downloading the Skool Loop app a step by step guide




Once you have downloaded the Skool Loop App, via either your Google Play or App store, please follow the below instructions to select your school


- Open the Skool Loop App you will land on a welcome page.
- 2. Click the 'Select your schools' this will bring you to a menu you can either search your school or follow the country/region prompts.
- Once you reach your school, select it with the tick on the righthand side. You can select as many schools as required.
- 4. Tap the 'select schools' button in the top right corner.
- 5. Tap the big orange choose button. This will load your school and bring you to the settings page.
- 6. Subscribe to the groups that are relevant to you, then click the 'go back' button on your phone, which will bring you to the main screen of your schools app.
- 7. Use the circular arrow button at the top of the main screen to toggle between your chosen schools.
