Welcome to the first term of 2020!

This term we have many exciting things organised. Our inquiry will be based around Te Tiriti o Waitangi. We will continue with our Novel Readings and Short Stories. Writing will cover all genre with instructional writing linking in with the programming of our robots. With the development of the New Zealand Curriculum to include Digital Technologies we will be focusing on coding (plugged and unplugged). This year Technology will be held at Tautoro Kura and will run in Terms 2 & 3. The Technology programme is still in development, however, there are some amazing projects in the pipeline. A very exciting time for our students.

We will also continue with our Careers Aspirations - Personalised Pathways (CaPP). CaPP allows each student to develop a personalised pathway that responds to their strengths, interests and career aspirations. Last year the students' experience of CaPP was positive. At the beginning of every year each student creates or redevelops their CAPP, these are created so that the student sees their uniqueness and understands that their CAPP works in conjunction with their individualised learning pathway (ILP). They have an awareness that both their CAPP and ILP influence the choices they and their whanau make not only for their immediate schooling but also for their future learning and employment.
