<u>MISSING: School Bluetooth Speaker.</u> We now have our bluetooth speaker returned. Thank you!! It was very disappointing to be informed that one of our local families had lifted it from our school. We will now be very vigilant with ensuring that our school alarms are set every night and during weekends. This is another reason that we will be locking our school gates every day.

Due to the vaping incident on the school bus a couple of weeks ago (07/09), we request that students no longer bring pouch bags (i.e. hip pack or waist bags) to school. Thank you in advance for your understanding.

We have had another incident of a student with a vaporizer (e-cigarette) at school. If you have vaporizers in your homes, can you please ensure that they are either locked away or ensure that the owner has them when your child leaves for school. It is becoming a huge problem in our little school and consuming a lot of staff time.

RINGWORM - We have now had several cases of ringworm. This is very contagious. Please check all body parts of your child to ensure that they do not have any abnormalities. Ringworm requires treatment - a cream that your local doctor can prescribe. We are trying to do everything to avoid stray cats and dogs on our grounds. Families may have pets that are passing on ringworm. Please get your pets checked.
